According to the provider, this database is designed to support global awareness. Gale in Context ties together a wealth of authoritative content to help students critically analyze and understand the most important issues of the modern world.

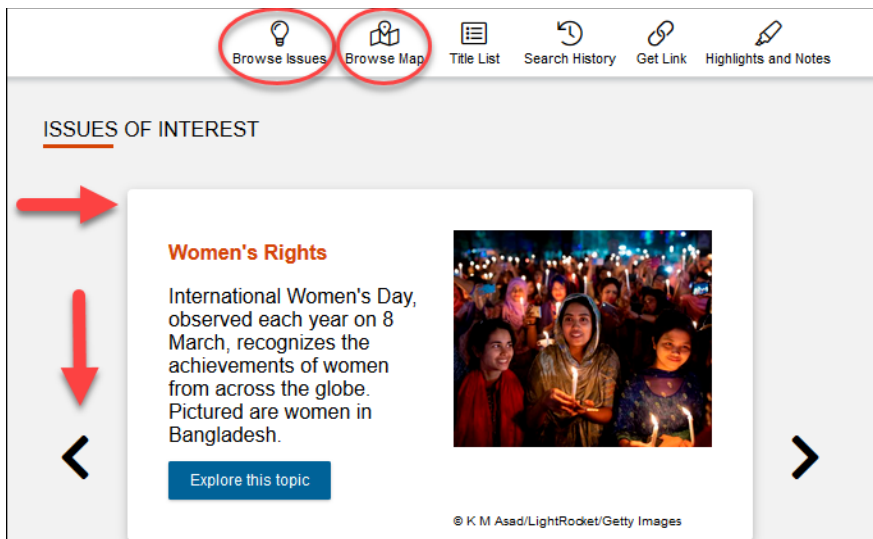
## Using the Database

**Step 1:** There are several options for searching the database: Using the Search box at the top of the page, browsing Issues, clicking on Browse Map to open a world map for browsing, or clicking on one of the Issues of Interest scrolling at the top of the page. Begin with the Search box at the top if a topic is already in mind.

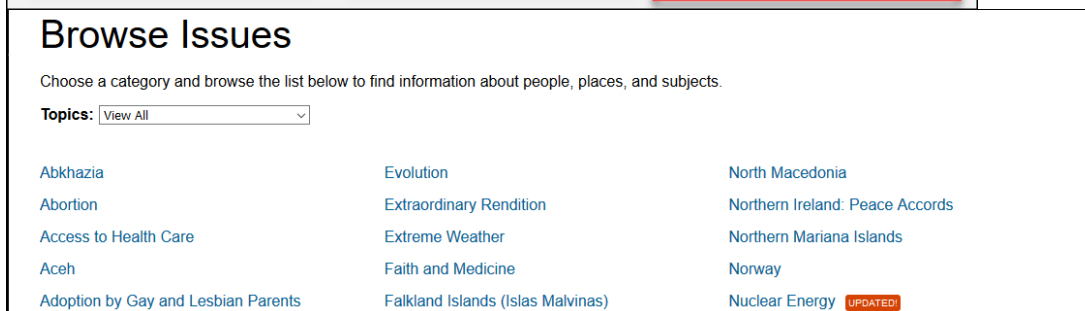

Advanced Search



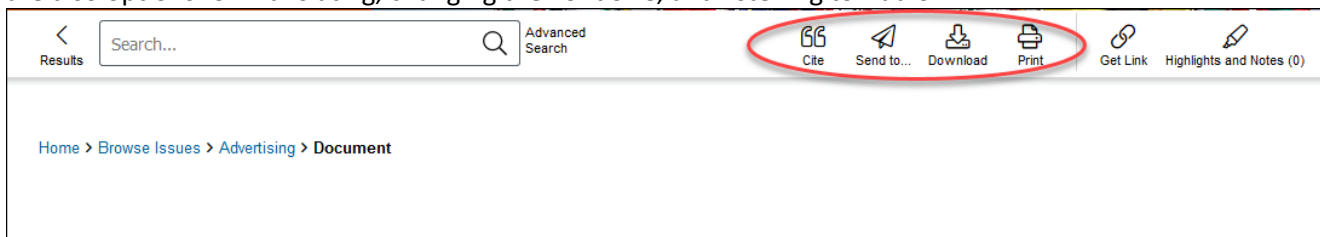
**Step 2:** To find a topic, try searching the Browse All Issues option. Click on an appropriate heading for that subject's research. On the next page, articles are available from different sources among the research topic.



**Note:** Across the top of the page are options to sort the articles by categories such as News, Academic Journals, Magazines, and more.

**Step 3:** Clicking on an article leads to the full text of the article, if available.

**Step 4:** At the top of the page, there are tools to Cite, Send, Download, and Print the article, among other options. There are also options for Translating, changing the Font Size, and listening to Audio.



**Note:** Breadcrumbs across the top work to go to previously accessed pages on the site.

**Step 5:** At the bottom of the page is a Source Citation; double check it against a citation handbook to ensure it is correct. There is also a link to similar articles.
