**Step 1:** At the top of the CINAHL Complete database, click on 'CINAHL Headings'.

**Step 2:** Type in your search term. For example, type in 'DNR', and click 'Browse'. This will bring up a list of results and terms available for your search.





## Using an Article


**Step 1:** View an article by clicking the 'PDF Full Text' or 'HTML Full Text' link to view the article.
