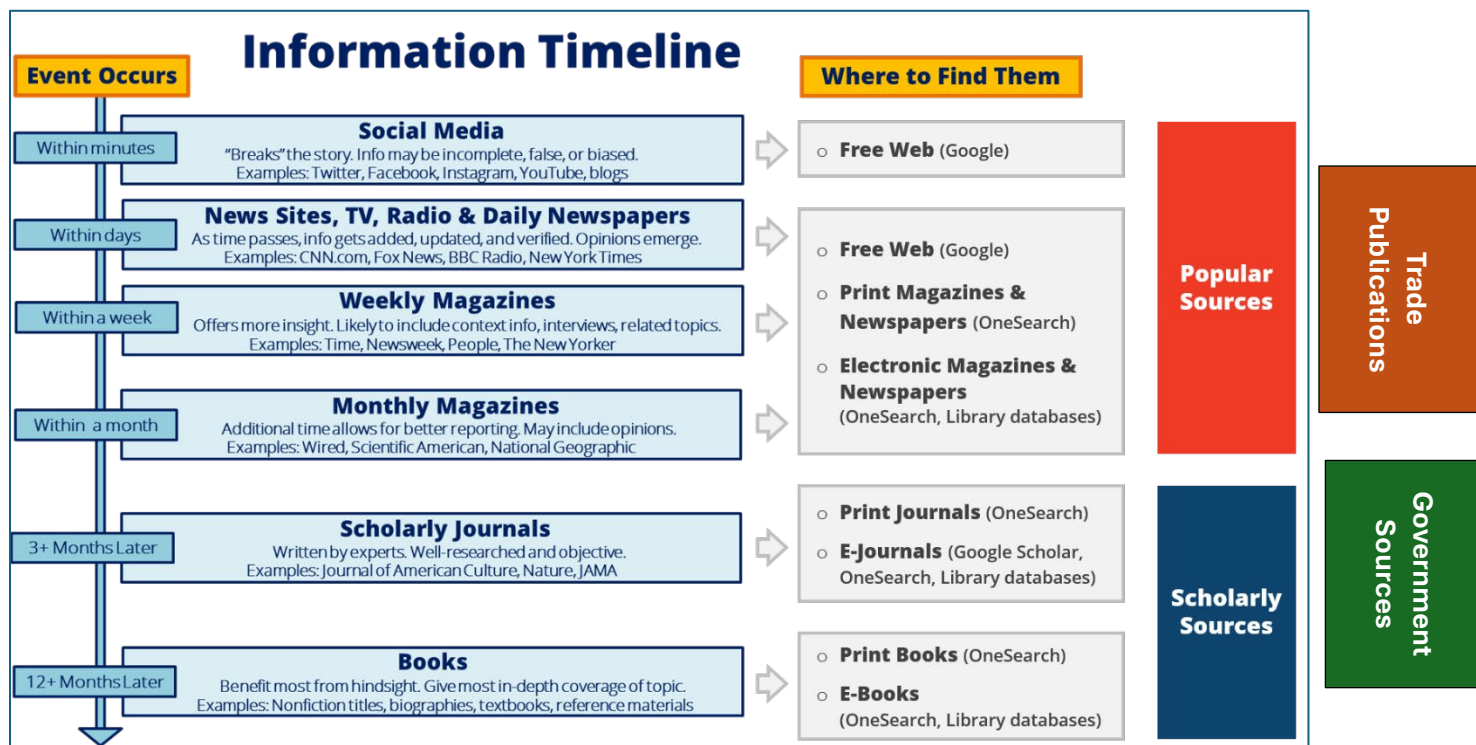

## Building & Planning Standards: From Professional Associations

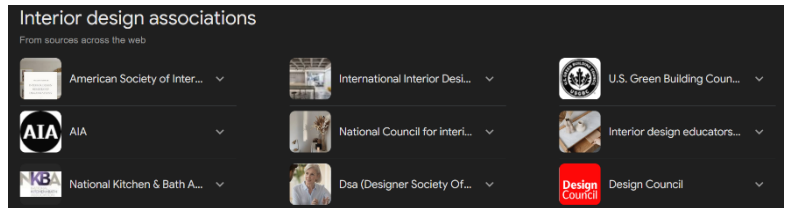
“Building standards approach the standardization of buildings from multiple standpoints. Design considerations such as energy efficiency and seasonal thermal performance are covered alongside structural design and service-

life planning. The International Code Council standards provide a framework for building design, construction, and maintenance through its [collection of sixteen building codes](#). Lastly, there is a focus on door standards published by BHMA due to their importance in safety and functionality.” **Note: these are for sale from [The American National Standards Institute \(ANSI\)](#)**

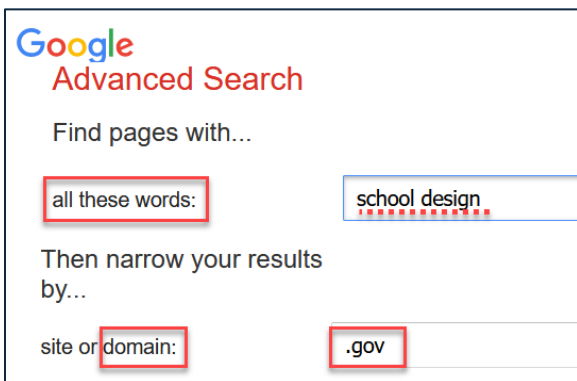

## Codes & ordinances: Legal requirements

International > Federal > State > County > Village/City

“The State of Illinois recently passed legislation ([Public Act 103-0510](#)) changing the Capital Development Board Act to require **statewide building codes effective 1/1/2025**. Until then, units of local government such as cities and counties can adopt codes of their choice. The best and most accurate answers to building code questions must be answered by your city, village, or county code official.”

Information from the city and county zoning ordinances, building codes (UBC) and accessibility guidelines will impose important restrictions or requirements on your project.

	<b>City Ordinance</b>	<b>City Code</b>
<b>Legislative Level</b>	An ordinance is a specific law or regulation passed by a city council or other local legislative body.	A city code refers to a comprehensive set of laws, including ordinances, regulations, and administrative rules, organized systematically by subject matter.
<b>Scope and Coverage</b>	Ordinances tend to address specific and often singular issues or regulations.	City codes encompass a broader spectrum of laws and regulations, covering multiple areas such as zoning, building, health, and safety.
<b>Hierarchy &amp; Structure</b>	Ordinances are part of the city code but exist as individual laws, often numbered or titled separately.	A city code organizes ordinances along with other regulations and rules into a structured and organized system, often divided into chapters or sections.
<b>Accessibility &amp; Reference</b>	Ordinances can be standalone documents that are referenced within the broader code.	City codes serve as a centralized reference point, incorporating and organizing all ordinances and related laws into a single document or database.
<b>Amendment Process</b>	Modifying or adding ordinances typically involves the city council or legislative body passing new legislation or revising existing ones.	City codes are updated periodically to incorporate changes in ordinances, regulations, or laws, with amendments requiring extensive review and approval.
